Reminder - Change to May INSET day

Just a reminder that there has been a slight change to our term dates for this year. Our May INSET day will now be on **FRIDAY 28TH MAY** (the Friday before the half term) rather than Friday 21st of May. I hope that this will actually be more convenient for families and that this is sufficient notice for it not to be disruptive.

Dear Parents,

Many of you will have heard the announcement that schools have been permitted to alter their existing calendars in order to close on Friday the 18th December.

After much consideration, we have chosen to keep the school open on the 18th. There are several reasons for this decision. Firstly, closure on Friday will not remove the possibility of pupils and staff having to isolate over the Christmas period. Typically, the window for the transmission of COVID19 is 2-3 days prior to people becoming symptomatic. It is then usually 2-3 days to get a test and receive a result. Based on these timescales, the school might contact you at any time up until Christmas Eve to inform you that your child has been in close contact with a positive case and that they will need to isolate. The only difference closing on the 18th would make is that the theoretical endpoint for being exposed within school would be the 23rd rather than the 24th. However, all of this is conditional on there being no delays with testing or receiving results.

Secondly, closing on Friday 18th provides families with too little notice, especially coupled with all the restrictions related to COVID19 and Christmas. A change at this late stage will put unnecessary pressure on parents at such a busy time of year.

Thirdly, closing on Friday 18th would mean having to use one of the INSET days later in the year which we have already identified for staff training that cannot be conducted on Friday.

Finally, as rates within Richmond are currently relatively low and falling, and as the school has not recently had a positive case, the risk remains relatively minimal as long as we all continue to be vigilant and follow the rules and procedures which have been put in place.

Reporting Results During Christmas

Over the Christmas period, the phones in the school office will not be being checked daily. It is therefore vital that if you need to report a positive result prior to Christmas on the absence email we set up at the start of the year:

This email will be checked daily up until Christmas Day to enable us to contact any staff or pupils who might need to isolate. Any messages regarding positive cases and isolation will be sent to you via SCOPay.

If your child shows symptoms after Christmas and has a test, you do not need to inform the school but we always want to support our families, so rest assured that you can contact via this email if you need support.

Remaining Vigilant

I am so grateful for your help and support in keeping our pupils safe, happy and in school this half term. As we all eagerly anticipate Christmas and particularly the opportunity to see our loved ones, I would ask that you remain vigilant and continue to follow all the measures that have been put in place.

It is harder than ever at this time of year to avoid contact with others and to socially distance but please do try to follow this guidance throughout next week as nobody in our community wants to be in isolation over the Christmas period..
