Anti-Bullying Week – 16th November

Worple Street

Unfortunately, we have received another complaint regarding parents driving down Worple Street at pick up and drop off. Whilst we understand that it is difficult for parents who come for further afield, the matter may soon be out of the school's hands.

The frequency and strength of local residents' complaints means that they are now speaking directly to the local council regarding introducing permits and possible traffic restrictions to Worple Street at pick up and drop off times.

As our requests to park nearby and walk have been persistently ignored by a small

number of parents, the school has no other choice but to support these measures going forward. This would be in line with the measures other Richmond schools have taken, many of whom have a zero drive policy. It also reflects our Eco ambitions for pupils to arrive on foot, bike or scooter rather than by car.

Cycle Schools

If you are thinking of swapping your car for a bike, there are now free online Cycle Skills courses available to help you travel confidently and safely. TfL offer a free online course for both experienced and new cyclists. The Cycle Skills course covers everything from getting your bike set up for your first ride to tips for cycling safely in London. Of particular interest is the 'Cycling with Children' module, which is great for teachers and parents looking for active travel options for the school run.
