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Attendance

At St Mary Magdalen's we have always been incredibly proud of our children's excellent attendance. Historically, attendance has been 97% or above which is the aspirational target set by Richmond upon Thames primary schools as we are aware of the importance of regular attendance for pupils' education, wellbeing, and long-term development. However, we are aware that all families face challenges and that we do have some pupils who are persistently absent. We have been looking closely at attendance this half term and will continue to do so in November. We will then arrange to meet with the parent or carer of pupils who have low attendance to see what we can do to help and support them going forward. In the meantime, please feel free to contact us if there is anything we can do to support your child and your family.

Wonderful Workshops

It is fantastic to begin to enrich our curriculum further by having workshops in school, something we did so often before the pandemic. This week both Year 4 and Year 3 enjoyed workshops from visiting experts.

On Thursday, Year 1 Circus participated in a Seaside workshop. The children visited different holiday destinations through the ages, meeting Punch and Judy in 1910, learning what holidays meant during wartime in 1940, exploring seaside activities in 1950, and taking a trip to Butlins summer camps in 1970. They compared this all to a modern-day seaside holiday. The children learned a lot of songs about the seaside. They did role play activities and even got to dress up. It was great to see all Year 1 children so enthusiastic and engaged in the workshop. It was a great end to our seaside topic. Year 1 can't wait for their second workshop next week.

On Tuesday, Year 4 had a fantastic interactive morning learning all about the Romans. They learnt about the types of clothing men and women wore, and how clothing was used to show wealth. The children acted out a burial and identified items that civilians might have needed for the afterlife, and considered why these were important. They also played with some fun roman toys and had a go at writing their name in Roman using a stylus and wax tablet. It was wonderful to see the children's enthusiasm throughout the morning and their eagerness to learn more!
