#### **School Uniform**

We are very fortunate that our wonderful parent volunteers, Mrs Parletti and Mrs Devine run our on-site uniform shop. Having some of our uniform on site is convenient and our volunteers' hard work also helps make it as affordable as possible. However, after several years of prices remaining the same, we have become aware that some of the items are now priced below their cost to the school. Whilst we do not aim to make a profit, selling the uniform is in fact costing the school money. Consequently, we have decided to put prices up so that we can cover our costs and are able to provide uniform free of charge to any pupil who cannot afford it.

## **Young Scientists**

On Thursday, Year 1 participated in a workshop entitled- The Science Machine, Animals, Habitats and Lifecycles. An eccentric scientist gave the children lots of challenging tasks including outwitting a disgruntled monster and saving the professor's science machine. 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## **House Competitions**

All children in our school are part of one of four Houses – Campion (Red), Fisher (Green), Mayne (Yellow) or More (Blue). As part of our behaviour policy, pupils' hard work and exemplary behaviour earns them points for their House and each half term, the House with the most points wins a reward, for example an additional mufti (non-uniform) day. The winners of his half term will be announced in Mrs Farrell-Cotton's assembly on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> November and will have their own mufti (non-uniform) day on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> November.

As well as rewarding our pupils for their attitude and effort on a daily basis, house points can also be earnt in House competitions. These competitions help us to strengthen our school community by providing opportunities for children to work collaboratively with pupils outside their class towards a common goal. Our first competition began this week, as our Year 6 class took part in a dodgeball tournament. All our classes will take part in this competition over the next half term and we look forward to having a range of House competitions throughout the year that allow all our pupils to try different activities and explore their talents, whether they are a budding musician, a brilliant baker or a future Olympian.

## Shop 'til You Drop

As part of preparing our children for life outside school our Year 6 pupils take part in "Shop 'til You Drop". This is an exciting initiative where the children work together to devise a money-making enterprise. They bid for funding, work out the costs, run events, stalls and activities, hopefully make a lot of money and most of all have a lot of fun along the way. This year, the children will be presenting their ideas to our School Council to get their initial investment. They will be running events throughout the autumn term and will have an in-school Christmas Market on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> December, which is great fun for the whole school.
