## Maths Adventure Day

In addition to our maths celebration on Thursday 30th June, we have also invited Subject Revolution in to lead a Maths Adventure Day across the whole school. The hall will be converted using 3D designed backdrops, props and resources and the KS2 children will be taking part in an interactive adventure called The Dark Codes. It is an escape-room style event where the children will work in teams, using their maths skills in practical challenges to reveal codes needed to defeat an alien invasion. There will be interactive videos, theatre and some big surprises along the way. The EYFS and KS1 event involves the children working  
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in teams using their maths to save a hapless Prince. The children will be using a range of maths skills including logic, shape, pattern and number and applying these skills in a fun and meaningful way. There will be lots of application of skills and knowledge and will generate a real buzz about maths in the school!

### **School Trips**

It has been wonderful for our pupils to be able to go out and about on some school trips this term. These excursions really make the most of the wonderful attractions we have in the local area and are planned to enrich the children's learning. This week many of our children have visited the Barnes Literature Festival and been inspired by the authors and illustrators they have met. Our Year 3 children have visited the British Museum and our Reception and Year 1 children have visited the Vauxhall City Farm. A huge thank you to Mrs Barrett and the teachers for organising these trips and to all the parents who have helped out. These trips would not be possible without your support.
